Laxmi Vilas Palace

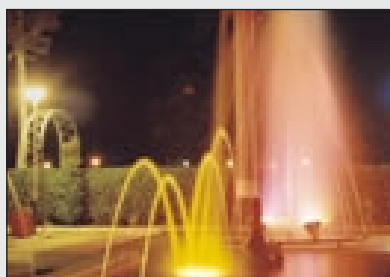

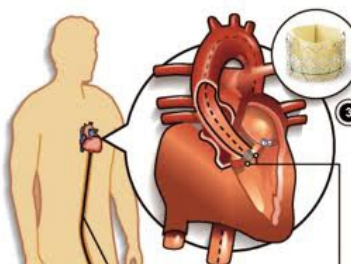

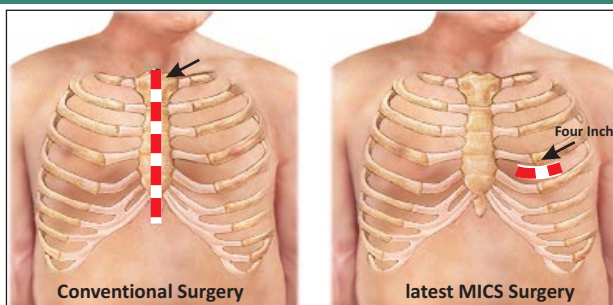
