
Maharaja Fateh Singh Museum

Sayaji Baug also known as Kamati Baug is a well-known park located on the River Vishwamitri at a distance of 2kms from the city. The major attraction is the floral


clock, situated at the center of the garden and is the first of its kind in Gujarat. Decorated with sculptures placed on pedestals, it is an ideal place to rest and relax with well


